One of the poorest countries in the Western Hemisphere, Haiti remains susceptible to natural disasters and vulnerable to price spikes in the global food market. Drought conditions, political instability, and worsening economic conditions have resulted in food insecurity across Haiti.


SITUATION

- ❖ Haiti is ranked 169 of 189 countries on the 2019 Human Development Index.
 - A series of natural disasters over the past couple of decades has resulted in the population of Haiti having limited access to electricity, clean water, adequate sanitation or healthcare. Half of the population is considered undernourished, while 22% of children are chronically malnourished.
- ❖ Haiti has one of the highest levels of food insecurity in the world, and they need our help. According to the Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC) analysis, more than I in 3 people need urgent food assistance, that is nearly 3.7 million people.
- The Famine Early Warning System estimates that hundreds of t housands of Haitiansare experiencing Crisis (IPC 3) levels of food insecurity—requiring emergency food assistance—I million people face Crisis levels of food insecurity in the coming months as Haiti enters the lean season.*

RESPONSE

- Liberland Aid Foundation (LAF) has developed the diplomatic and logistical channels necessary to begin providing food, medical supplies, and educational assistance to the people of Haiti, and we are calling on our supporters to help us make this project successful.
- Wholesale grocers have generously offered to donate goods to support LAF's humanitarian relief efforts in Haiti. Through close cooperation with wholesale grocers and the Haitian government LAF will begin delivering the relief that the Haitian people disparately need. 100% of your donation will go towards financing the cost of shipping this food to Haiti.
- ❖ LAF has been offered a 40' shipping container of food items per day, which is approximately 20 tons of goods per shipping container. The amount of food that wholesale grocer has offered to donate potentially adds up to over 14,000,000 pounds of food annually or 18 million meals. This project has the potential to provide an estimated 50,000 people with at least I meal a day, or 17,000 people with 3 meals per day for a year.
- We need your help to get this food to the people of Haiti. Each container will cost 4k USD to transport from the United States to Port-Au-Prince, Haiti, and with your support we have the opportunity to make a massive impact on thousands of lives.







^{*}The Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC) is a standardized tool that aims to classify the severity and magnitude of acute food insecurity. The IPC scale, which is comparable across countries, ranges from Minimal (IPC I) to Famine (IPC5).
